In identifying a new 'rationalist' school of Turkish theology and outlining its different manifestations, the book breaks new ground. It fills a significant gap in the literature on Islamic studies and reveals an understudied dimension of

Turkey and Turkish Islam beyond the well-known ideas of the AKP and the Gulenists.
